Follow this prayer guide for eight days with specific prayers for each area. May God come in power as we lift up His name and call upon Him to work mightily throughout Colorado!










STATE MISSIONS

“Lord, you have been our refuge in every generation.
Before the mountains were born, before you gave
birth to the earth and the world, from eternity to
eternity, you are God.” Psalm 90:1-2

From every corner of the state, we lift our eyes to the hills, and remember where our help comes from. No one who has stood on Pike’s Peak can doubt His size. No one who has watched the sun set over the Sangre de Cristos can deny His beauty. Do we also grasp that our mighty Creator sees us, knows us, loves us individually?
